NEC CODE CORNER

The 2023 NEC Code Making Process

Every three years, the National Electrical Code (NEC) is revised and often expanded. The 2023 NEC development cycle was completed on June 9, 2022, in Boston at the 2022 NFPA Conference & Expo. The NFPA received 4,006 public inputs (Pl's, proposals) recommending Code changes, resulting in 1,805 first revisions (FR's, code changes). The NFPA also received 1,956 public comments (PC's) on the 1,805 first revisions, producing 900 second revisions (SR's, code changes). Also, there were 156 second correlating revisions (SCR's, code changes) created by the 18 code panels and twelve new articles added to the 2023 NEC.

A major change to the 2023 NEC is that all definitions are now located in Article 100 of the NEC. Other NFPA codes and standards utilize a single location for all definitions. This revision supports a more usable Code by requiring a consistent process to find definitions. In the 2023 NEC, Article 100 now contains well over 800 definitions in this article for this document.

There are twelve new articles for the 2023 NEC. Some of these new articles are existing articles relocated to better locations. Some of these new articles were developed to improve usability and to increase the focus on requirements associated with medium or high voltage requirements.

ARTICLE 235 Branch Circuits, Feeders, and Services Over 1000 Volts ac, 1500 Volts dc, Nominal

This article provides the general requirements for branch circuits, feeders, and services over 1000 volts ac or 1500 volts dc, nominal.

Article 245 Overcurrent Protection for Systems Rated Over 1000 Volts AC, 1500 Volts DC

This article covers overcurrent protection requirements for systems over 1000 volts ac, 1500 volts dc, nominal.

Article 305 General Requirements for Wiring Methods and Materials for Systems Rated Over 1000 Volts ac, 1500 Volts dc, Nominal This article covers wiring methods and materials for systems rated over 1000 volts ac, 1500 volts dc, nominal. This new article is intended to organize medium voltage (MV) information into a separate article to provide the electrical industry, including installers, with more direction in terms of medium voltage installations.

Article 315 Medium Voltage Conductors, Cables, Cable Joints, and Cable Terminations

This new article revises what was a new article for the 2020 NEC, Article 311, into a relocated Article 315. This article added requirements for medium voltage (MV) cable joints, MV cable connectors, and MV terminations to provide complete system installation for MV cables and conductors. This article includes voltages from 2001 volts to 35,000 volts ac, nominal and 2001 volts to 2500 volts dc, nominal.

Article 335 Instrumentation Tray Cable: Type ITC

This article revises and relocates previous Article 727 to new Article 335 covering the use, installation, and construction specifications of instrumentation tray cable (Type ITC). This article has application to instrumentation and control circuits operating at 150 volts or less and 5 amperes or less.

ARTICLE 369 Insulated Bus Pipe (IBP)/ Tubular Covered Conductors (TCC) Systems

This article covers the use, installation, and construction specifications for insulated bus pipe (IBP) systems. Article 100, Definitions states that Insulated Bus Pipe System Is an assembly that includes bus pipe, connectors, fittings, mounting structures, and other fittings and accessories. (CMP-8)

Article 371 Flexible Bus Systems

This article covers the use and installation requirements of flexible bus systems and associated fittings. Flexible bus systems are an assembly of flexible insulated bus, with a system of associated fittings used to secure, support, and terminate the bus. (CMP-8) Flexible bus systems are engineered systems for a specific site location

and are ordinarily assembled at the point of installation from the components furnished or specified by the manufacturer.

Article 395 Outdoor Overhead Conductors over 1000 Volts

Old Article 399 is relocated to new Article 395. The relocation improves usability and strengthens the focus on requirements associated with medium or high voltage in the Article xx5 location.

Article 512 Cannabis Oil Equipment and Cannabis Oil Systems Using Flammable Materials

This article covers cannabis oil preparatory equipment, extraction equipment, booths, post-processing equipment, and systems using flammable materials (flammable gas, flammable liquid–produced vapor, combustible liquid–produced vapor) in commercial and industrial facilities. There is no truth to the rumor that this was going to be Article 420!

Article 722 Cables for Power-Limited Circuits and Fault-Managed Power Circuits

This new Article combines common cabling requirements currently found in Articles 725, 760, and 770 of the 2020 NEC and relocates other cabling requirements from those articles into a single article. This new article will cover the general requirements for the installation of single-and multiple-conductor cables used in Class 2 and Class 3 power-limited circuits, power-limited fire alarm (PLFA) circuits, and class 4 fault-managed power circuits.

ARTICLE 724

Class 1 Power-Limited Circuits and

Class 1 Power-Limited Remote-Control and Signaling Circuits

In the 2020 NEC, Article 725 Class 1 Circuit language is now located in 2023 NEC Article 724. This new article covers Class 1 circuits that are not an integral part of a device or utilization equipment. Article 725 still exists and is titled

Class 2 and Class 3 Power-Limited Circuits. This new article was created for Class 1 circuits because these circuits are normally not recognized by the IT industry as power-limited circuits and should not be in the same article with Class 2 and Class 3 circuits.

ARTICLE 726 Class 4 Fault-Managed Power Systems

This article covers the installation of wiring systems and equipment, including utilization equipment of Class 4 fault-managed power (FMP) systems. These systems are characterized by monitoring the circuit for faults and controlling the source current to ensure the energy delivered into any fault is limited.

Presently, New York State is still enforcing the 2017 NEC. It is anyone's guess when the State will change to the 2020 or 2023 edition of the NEC. As new as the 2023 NEC is, the 2026 edition of the NEC is already in progress as the code making process continues. Here are some significant dates in the process –

September 7, 2023 - Public Input Closing Date. Submit a proposal for 2026 at NFPA.org/70.

July 10, 2024 – First Draft Report Posting Date for public comment. Review what is proposed for 2026.

August 28, 2024 – Public Comment Closing Date. Further review of proposals for 2026.

March 21, 2025 – Second Draft Report Posting Date. Review the code panel work as the 2026 process continues.

June 6, 2025 – Association Meeting for the NEC. The final I's dotted, and T's crossed for adoption of the 2026 NEC.

The 2023 edition of the National Electrical Code certainly meets the purpose of the code – sensible revisions reflecting advances in technology along with industry practices for the practical safeguarding of persons and property from hazards arising from the use of electricity.






