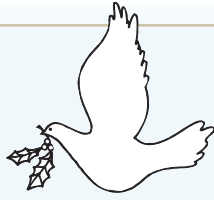

I.B.E.W. LOCAL 25 SCHOLARSHIP FUND

NEC CODE CORNER

This month we will continue to examine the **2023 National Electrical Code, Article 210.8 Ground-Fault Circuit Interrupter Protection for Personnel**, particularly **210.8(D) Specific Appliances**. In the **2020 NEC**, at section **210.8(D)**, it required a cross reference to **Article 422 Appliances**; section **422.5(A)** identified 7 appliances, including dishwashers, that require GFCI protection and section **422.5(B)** listed a choice of 5 protection methods to meet the requirement. For the **2023 NEC**, section **210.8(D)** has included 12 appliances that require GFCI protection, and allows for GFCI protection at the **branch circuit** or the appliance **outlet**. This code change eliminates the cross reference to see which appliances require GFCI protection. The 2023 edition of the National Electrical Code has specific language concerning many types of installations. Remember to consult the code book for additional information. The **Outline and Language** of the code is included below. Practice using the Codeology Method to answer all your code challenges.

CHAPTER, ARTICLE, PART, and SECTION!

2023 National Electrical Code
Chapter 2 Wiring and Protection
Article 210 Branch Circuits
Part I. General
Section 210.8 Ground-Fault Circuit-Interrupter Protection for Personnel.

210.8 Ground-Fault Circuit-Interrupter Protection for Personnel.

A listed Class A GFCI shall provide protection in accordance with 210.8(A) through (F).

The GFCI shall be installed in a readily accessible location.

210.8(D) Specific Appliances.

GFCI protection shall be provided for the

branch circuit or outlet supplying the following appliances rated 150 volts or less to ground and 60 amperes or less, single- or 3-phase:

- (1) Automotive vacuum machines
- (2) Drinking water coolers and bottle fill stations
- (3) High-pressure spray washing machines
- (4) Tire inflation machines
- (5) Vending machines
- (6) Sump pumps
- (7) Dishwashers
- (8) Electric ranges
- (9) Wall-mounted ovens
- (10) Counter-mounted cooking units
- (11) Clothes dryers
- (12) Microwave ovens

So what does this mean?

In the **2020 NEC**, section **210.8(D)** did not include any appliances needing GFCI protection, it only provided requirements for accomplishing GFCI protection, requiring a cross reference to sections **422.5(A)** and **(B)**, not the easiest way to use the code book. For the **2023 NEC**, section **210.8(D)** contains a list of twelve specific appliances, including five new appliances, all requiring GFCI protection, eliminating the cross reference to section **422.5**. The new appliances added to the list are electric ranges, wall-mounted ovens, counter-mounted cooking units, microwave ovens, and clothes dryers. Four of these five appliances are typically located in kitchens, which goes back to the previous NEC Code Corner article, section **210.8(A)(6) Kitchens**. List item (6) has been revised so that **ALL** kitchen **receptacles** require GFCI protection for personnel, not just those receptacles

serving countertops, and **210.8(D) Specific Appliances**, GFCI protection shall be provided for the **branch circuit or outlet** supplying appliances rated 150 volts or less to ground and 60 amperes or less, single-phase or 3-phase. Notice and remember that dishwashers, another kitchen appliance, is included in the list above. The 2023 edition of the National Electrical Code certainly meets the purpose of the code – sensible revisions reflecting advances in technology along with industry practices for the practical safeguarding of persons and property from hazards arising from the use of electricity.

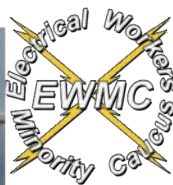

- 3rd) Terre Haute, IN - March 15, 1900. Defunct December 1907
- 4th) Long Island, NY - April 18, 1932 – Present

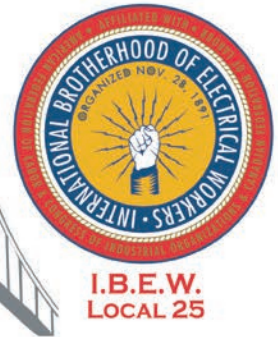
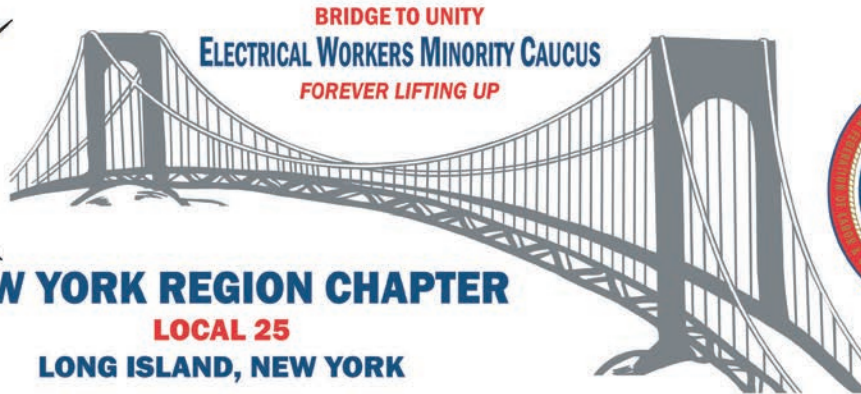
Dear Sisters and Brothers,

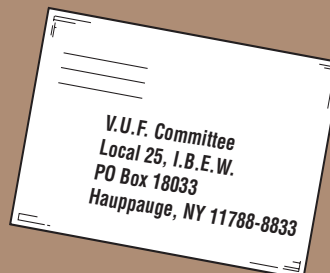

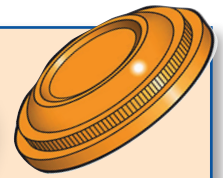

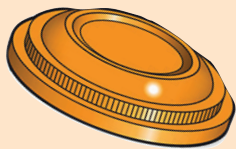

time with the help of a lawyer.

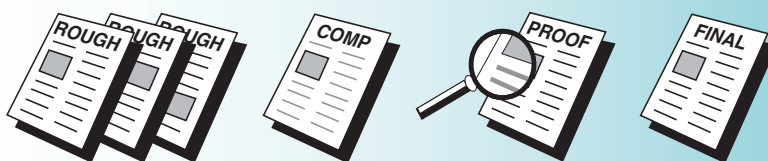
