Sisters and Brothers,

As I sit here and write this article for this issue of the Conduit, it is the middle of July and employment is still very good. Book 1 is clear, and we have been putting travelers out the last few weeks and should continue putting travelers out for the rest of the summer. Schools, hospitals, and Amazon jobs have been most of the calls that have

been hiring. Still, some of the real big jobs are just breaking ground, or will be very soon, and will be hiring later in the year. Good Samaritan Hospital, \$300 million; Forge River Sewer Project, \$250 million; Jakes 58, \$150 million; and UBS Retail Village, \$100 million. These are just a few jobs that are getting ready to start.

There have been some changes to the Local 25 Officers due to Jim Malley's retirement. Brother Ryan Casey was unanimously appointed by the Executive Board to fulfil Jim Malley's term as Financial Secretary. Ryan was Local 25's Treasurer for the past six years. Ryan was also an Executive Board member and an Examining Board member and has been a Local 25 Officer since 1998. To fulfil Brother Casey's term as Treasurer, the Executive Board unanimously appointed Sister Lisa Hofmann to fulfil the position of Treasurer. Sister Hofmann was previously an Examining Board member and was also the Chairperson of the JATC. To fulfil Sister Hofmann's position on the Examining Board, the Executive Board unanimously appointed Chanel Benson to fulfil the remainder of Sister Hofmann's Examining Board term.

As of July 1, 2022 all active members and retirees are now covered with cyber security protection at no cost to the member. The membership at the May union meeting approved that the Local pay the three dollar cost per member per year to have this protection. The total cost is approximately nine thousand dollars, which I believe will be well worth the investment. There will be information on the company that is handling the caseload on page three of the Conduit and on the website.

Some upcoming conferences that will be coming up in August and September are the IBEW Third District Progress Meeting, IBEW Women's Conference, and the IBEW Membership Development Conference.

Some Local 25 events that will be coming up this summer: Yankee game July 31; Local 25 Annual Block Party, August 13; and the Local 25 Annual Softball Tournament, August 26, 27, and 28. We will be going to a Jet game in October and hopefully a Giant game also. So, when you see the text come in on your cell phone, get your name on the list as soon as possible.


Hello Sisters and Brothers.



Other features of the site include the ability to view your:

- Pension credit summary;
- Work history for all years from 2013 to present;
- Vacation payments issued, including the breakdown of taxes and fees;
- · Eligibility for health coverage.

Listed below is the website address for MemberXG. When you sign on for the first time, you will be asked to provide an email address and a password. The information on this site is very personal to you, do not share your login information with anyone and be sure to keep your login information stored in a safe place that only you can access. Your

spouse can create their own account to view their eligibility. We suggest using a personal email address and not one that you might currently have through your employer. If you lose your login information, just click on the "Can't access your account?" tab at the bottom of the login page to help you gain access.




