BUSINESS MANAGER'S REPORT

Sisters and Brothers,

As I sit here and write this article for the Conduit, it is the first week in April, and finally we are coming out of the cold winter months. Employment is still strong and once again we are starting to get into Book 2 putting travelers out again. We should stay strong with employment for the rest of the year. The Calverton Solar Farm has been ramping up the last

few weeks and should continue for a while. Some other projects ready to start soon are the 75,000 sq ft Welcome Center at Brookhaven Lab, phase 2 of the Ronkonkoma Hub, the 250-million-dollar Good Samaritan Hospital job, Retail Village at UBS Arena, Avalon job in Amityville, the old Touro College job, more Amazon jobs, and the 2.5 million sq ft of industrial space at exit 66 Sills Road South Service Road, just to name a few.

At the February Union Meeting, the membership voted on a Bylaw change to lower the union dues by a half percent. This is the second time in two years that we have been fortunate to lower the dues. In the last two years, the union dues have been lowered by one full percent.

Last year, for the year 2021, the Funds did very well. The Annuity did 9.4%, the 401k Fund did 9.6% and the Pension Fund did 15.9%. I am happy to report that the Pension is now fully funded for the first time at 109%.

As of today, we are in the middle of contract negotiations for both the "A" Construction contract and the CW/CE contract. I will have more details in the next Conduit article.

The past month has been very busy for the office. We had the New York City/Long Island Building Trades Conference, then the IBEW Construction Maintenance Conference, then the National Building Trades Legislative Conference - all the while still meeting with NECA twice a week to negotiate the contracts. In May we have the IBEW International Convention.

In the last Conduit I mentioned that we should be up over 3-million-man hours for the year 2021. Well, we hit our mark and then some. Local 25 man-hours for 2021 were 3,526,306. These were the best hours in twenty years.

Brothers and Sisters, that ends my report for this issue of the Conduit. Remember to work safe, turn off energized circuits, and always stick together out there.

NEC CODE CORNER

This month we will examine Article 250.64(B) (2) and (B)(3), Grounding Electrode Conductor Installation, Exposed to Physical Damage. This revision explains that when using PVC conduit to protect grounding electrode conductors, Schedule 80 PVC conduit is required for protection of grounding electrode conductors from physical damage. Schedule 40 PVC conduit does not offer the impact and crush resistant characteristics required for providing protection from physical damage that Schedule 80 PVC conduit provides. The National Electrical Code has specific language concerning many types of installations. Remember to consult the code book for additional information. The **Outline and Language** of the code is included below. Practice using the Codeology Method to answer all your code challenges.

CHAPTER, ARTICLE, PART, and SECTION!

2020 National Electrical Code

Chapter 2 Wiring and Protection Article 250 Grounding and Bonding

<u>Part</u> III. Grounding Electrode System and

Grounding Electrode Conductor

Section 250.64(B)(2) Exposed to Physical Damage

250.64(B)(3) Smaller than 6 AWG.

250.64(B)(2) Exposed to Physical Damage.

A 6 AWG or larger copper or aluminum grounding electrode conductor exposed to physical damage shall be protected in rigid metal conduit (RMC), intermediate metal conduit (IMC), **Schedule 80** rigid polyvinyl chloride conduit (PVC), reinforced thermosetting resin conduit Type XW (RTRC-XW), electrical metallic tubing (EMT), or cable armor.

250.64(B)(3) Smaller Than 6 AWG.

Grounding electrode conductors smaller than 6 AWG shall be protected in RMC, IMC, **Schedule 80** PVC, RTRC-XW, EMT, or cable armor.

So what does this mean?

This revision points out the type of PVC conduit that is suitable and identified to provide protection physical damage when protecting against grounding electrode conductors. Schedule 80 PVC conduit provides impact and cruch resitant characteristics, while Schedule 40 does not. Previous editions of the National Electrical Code did not differentiate between Schedule 40 or Schedule 80 PVC to be used in these two code sections. This code revision clearly states that if using PVC conduit, only Schedule 80 PVC conduit can be used to provide protection from physical damage when protecting grounding electrode conductors. In the NEC, whenever PVC conduit is permitted to be used to provide protection from physical damage, PVC conduit marked "Schedule 80" is required to be used. Schedule 40 PVC conduit is suitable for underground use by direct burial or encasement in concrete. It is also suitable for aboveground use indoors or outdoors exposed to sunlight and weather where **not** subject to physical damage. Schedule 40 PVC conduit cannot be used in any location where protection from physical damage is required. PVC conduits marked "Schedule 80" can be used in all applications mentioned above and where subject to physical damage, as explained in the Informational Note at 352.10(F) Exposed.

The Electrical Industry Board is happy to announce the launch of its MemberXG website. This website will enable Local 25 members online access to view important benefit information, such as Annuity, 401k and MRA account balances.

Other features of the site include the ability to view your:

- Pension credit summary;
- Work history for all years from 2013 to present;
- Vacation payments issued, including the breakdown of taxes and fees;
- Eligibility for health coverage.

Listed below is the website address for MemberXG. When you sign on for the first time, you will be asked to provide an email address and a password. The information on this site is very personal to you, do **not** share your login information with anyone and be sure to keep your login information stored in a safe place that only you can access. Your spouse can create their own account to view their eligibility. We suggest using a personal email address and not one that you might currently have through your employer. If you lose your login information, just click on the "Can't access your account?" tab at the bottom of the login page to help you gain access.


LOCAL 25 BAGPIPE BAND




